ABOUT THIS WORSHIP SERVICE

Welcome to Echoes of the Manger. The dictionary tells us that an echo is a repetition of sound. This Christmas worship service will serve as a tool that will enable us to repeat sounds that have been heard from the beginning of time. They are sounds that come from Eden, from the mouths of the prophets, from the fields of Bethlehem, and from those who lived at the time of Jesus. They all echo the same sound. It says God Loves Us!

This service is divided into five parts:

Part 1: ECHOES OF PROMISE
Part 2: ECHOES OF BETHLEHEM
Part 3: ECHOES FROM THE FIELDS
Part 4: ECHOES OF JESUS' FRIENDS
Part 5: ECHOES OF GOD'S LOVE

Each part is introduced by a short poem recited by the little children.

RECITATIONS AND NARRATIONS

Although this service is written with two narrators, feel free to divide up those spoken parts as you wish. Sections marked RECITATION usually contain Scripture verses to be recited.

SONGS

In keeping with the theme of echoes, the songs all echo responses from other countries and other eras. The theme song, *Echoes of the Manger*, serves as both the processional and recessional. If using the accompaniment CD, the entire song is played through once before the children begin singing. This was done purposely to give more children an opportunity to already be in the sanctuary when they begin singing. When used as the recessional, you might suggest that the congregation joins in the singing of *Silent Night*.

BANNERS

Banner patterns have been provided for five chancel banners. As each new part is introduced in the service, another banner is brought to the forefront. Place banners as close to one another as possible. When all five banners are displayed, they produce a large mural depicting the theme of this service.

Responsive Reading: (Psalm 71)

Pastor: As for me, I will always have hope; I will praise you more and more.

Congregation: My mouth will tell of your righteousness, of your salvation all day long, though I know not its measure.

Congregation Song

Narrator 1: There is an amazing wonder that God has allowed to take place in our world. This wonder is something that all of us have experienced. It is a marvel that is produced by sound waves reflecting off objects like walls or mountains.

Narrator 2: This wonder only lasts for a moment since it travels at more than 1,000 feet a second.

Narrator 1: Sometimes this wonder can be a nuisance if it happens in a theater or concert hall, and great measures are taken to avoid it in recording studios.

Narrator 2: Sometimes it can also work for our good. With it, sailors can determine the direction and distance of cliffs in foggy weather. It can even be used to find oil deposits or schools of fish.

Narrator 1: Perhaps by now you've guessed that this is the marvelous wonder of ECHOES.

Narrator 2: Tonight we will listen to some echoes. These aren't echoes of sound, but rather echoes of a very special message—the message of GOD'S SAVING LOVE.

Narrator 1: The echoes of God's saving love have been heard for thousands of years but the message they bring is just as fresh and beautiful today as it was at the beginning of time.

Narrator 2: Listen to the words of God as He echoes this massage to each one of us. Listen to the echo of these three unforgettable words: "I love you".

Narrator 1: And listen to our words tonight as we re-echo our love for Him in our recitations and in each traditional Christmas carol we sing.

Narrator 2: Sometimes echoes are frightening, like the echoes that thunder makes. A frightening echo was heard in the Garden of Eden after man sinned. He was now separated from God, and his perfect relationship with his loving Father was destroyed. And the saddest part of all was that this affected not only Adam and Eve, but it echoes through all people who have been born after that time.

Narrator 1: Imagine how God must have been grieved when he saw Adam and Eve reject His love.

Narrator 2: But God's love rose high above man's sin as He announced to Adam and Eve:

Recitation: "And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel." Genesis 3 verse 15.

Narrator 1: God's love caused Him to work out a solution to the problem man had made. God chose to send His Son Jesus, to bear the punishment that sin had caused.

Narrator 2: These echoes of a promised Savior were sounded by God's people for nearly 4000 years as they waited for the Messiah to come.

Recitation: Moses echoed Jesus' coming when he wrote, "The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own brothers. You must listen to Him." Deuteronomy 18:15

Recitation: Isaiah echoed Jesus' coming when he said, "For to us a child is born, to us a Son is given, and the government will be on His shoulders. And He will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." Isaiah 9:6.

Recitation: Even Jeremiah, the weeping prophet, sounded the echo when he wrote, "The days are coming, declares the Lord, when I will raise up to David a righteous Branch." Jeremiah 23:5. Jesus was that branch.

Recitation: Daniel also echoed a prophecy about the coming Savior when he wrote, "He was given authority, glory and sovereign power; all peoples, nations and men of every language worshiped Him. . . And His kingdom is one that will never be destroyed." Daniel 7:14.

Recitation: Even Job, in all his grief and misery, echoes these unforgettable words of the hope he had, "I know that my Redeemer lives, and that in the end He will stand upon the earth. And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God; I myself will see Him with my own eyes—I, and not another. How my heart yearns within me!" Job 19:25.

Narrator 1: And so the echo continues as God's people waited for the Promised One who would bring them the hope of salvation.

Narrator: Our songs tonight are all echoes from the past, written by God's people in many different places and at many different times. At this very moment families around the world are

sharing the story of Christmas, echoing the message of God's love. Listen now as we hear this message as it was sung in Scandinavian homes many years ago.

Song: (Middle Grades)

The Happy Christmas Comes Once More
The happy Christmas comes once more,
The heavenly Guest is at the door,
The blessed words, the shepherd's thrill,
The joyous tidings of good will.

Recitation: "In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria. And everyone went to his own town to register."

Narrator 2: God chose a special man to be the earthly father for his Son.

Recitation: "So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David." **Narrator 1:** God had carefully chosen the young lady to be the mother of his Son.

Recitation: "He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child."

Narrator 2: God even chose the ideal time and place for this birth.

Recitation: "While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn."

Narrator: The beautiful message of the birth of Jesus is echoed in this traditional carol from Austria.

Song: (Middle Grades) *Above on the Mountain*

Recitation: Love created a beautiful place for God's special friends: Adam and Eve.

Recitation: Love gave them the hope of everlasting life—even after they willingly sinned against God.

Recitation: Love continued to echo throughout the Old Testament as God prepared the proper time and place for the ultimate display of this love.

Recitation: Love caused the almighty God to humble himself to be born in a manger to a young frightened girl.

Recitation: Love caused Jesus to willingly die on the cross for your sins and mine.

Recitation: Love showed us that just as Jesus rose from the dead, so also will we rise again.

Recitation: Love is the reason that our Savior is at this very moment preparing a beautiful home in heaven for you and for me.

Narrator 1: Won't you join us as we tell this most wonderful message from the Bible which shows us this great love. May these words echo and re-echo in our hearts each and every day.

Men: Jeremiah 31 verse 3, "I have loved you with an everlasting love; I have drawn you with loving kindness."

Women: Ephesians 2 verses 4 and 5, "Because of His great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ."

Children: First John 3 verse 1, "How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God."

Everyone: John 3 verse 16, "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that

whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."
